What do we do

The charity was formed in 1986 to address the considerable benefits for people with disabilities and special needs to be had from contact with animals and plants. It is possible for them to not only derive considerable proven therapeutic benefit but also to develop skills, get education, get woek experience and reach personal targets with a sense of personal achievement in so doing.

The charity welcomes visitors and users from 5 years of age with all types of disability and special needs and provides free services which are not available from local authorities or commercial organisations.

Visitors are welcomed to enjoy the proven benefits of being close to our 70+ animals and nature. Our animals include: horses, donkeys, goats, pigs, sheep, ducks, chickens, rabbits, turkeys and guinea pigs. Maybe watch the horse riding or stroll through the purpose built raised vegetable and plant gardens or browse our charity shop of donated goods. Enjoy the Sensory Garden or explore the Nature Area which is bordered by the River Colne and The Duke of Northumberlands River. Our not profit cafe provides cheap light refreshment.

Activities and Opportunities

Horse Riding: Provides measurable proven therapeutic and tangible benefits which include improved confidence and helps foster a sense of personal achievement which is so important to people with disabilities and special needs. Novices without any experience of riding are welcome and also those with riding experience. We are associated with The Riding For The Disabled Association riding takes place under

the supervision of approved staff and volunteers. Maintaining this activity is hugely expensive so a nominal fee is charged for taking part.

Help look after the 70+ animals: Interaction with the animals is encouraged and some freely roam the site during the day. Opportunities include mucking out, cleaning, collecting chicken eggs, grooming and learning about animal health. This activity, which takes place under the supervision of qualified staff, provides proven benefits which include education, learn new skills, maybe learn to work with others as part of a team, improved self-confidence and helps to foster a sense of personal achievement.

Gardening and Horticulture: Help to plant, grow and harvest plants and vegetables in our purpose built raised garden and large polytunnel. All wheelchair friendly. This activity provides proven benefits which include education, learn new skills, improved self confidence and helps to foster a sense of personal achievement.

Help run our Not For Profit Cafe: This opportunity provides proven benefits of education, learn new skills including cash handling and confidence building. It is an opportunity ideally suited to those looking for genuine work experience as part of our programme of helping to enable people with disabilities and special needs enter the workplace.

No matter what a person's ability there is always an activity that can be participated in and enjoyed at the centre. These activities may be used to support current personal development. We also welcome the elderly and work placement schemes.

With the exception of horse riding, we do not charge for any of our services. The charity is funded entirely by charitable giving and occasional grants. We are grateful for all donations so please give as much as you can afford.
