Instructions:

This activity is best done sitting on the floor round the parachute. Place the rabbits onto the parachute, keep the parachute still on the ground, begin singing. Encourage the children to join in "Shh" and pause before shouting wake up. Then bounce the rabbits on the chute.

Count five monkeys onto the parachute. Bounce them up and down on the parachute singing the song. When it gets to "one fell off ..." bounce one monkey off the parachute. Keep the parachute still and sing the remaining part of the song.

One step, two step,


Flying in the air!

"My Bonnie Lies Over the Ocean"


The bubbles fly over the yellow. The bubbles fly over the green. The bubbles fly over the blue and red.

Instructions:

You need: Colour symbols/ switch/ bean bags matching those on the parachute.

Instructions:



Choose a child to crawl on the parachute. They crawl over the parachute while the song is sung.

When the song is finished point to the colour the child is on as ask what colour can you see? Ask them to respond using there preferred means of communication or matching a beanbag.

Alternatively change words to ..."could see, were all the other children...." And ask at the end "Who do you see?" child says or finds photo (say hello?) it is then that child's turn.

You need: Coloured pig/frog bean or or

Instructions: Have five coloured
(pig/frog) beanbags in a box.
Begin the rhyme handing out
the red one to a child, child then places it
on that coloured panel of the parachute.
Continue with other colours, on the last
one throw it onto the parachute and then
slowly count "1,2..." then bounce the
parachute to fly the pigs in the air.

You need: Soft toy fish





Instructions:

Place the fish onto the parachute. Choose a child to catch a fish when they hear their name. Sing the song while making waves with the parachute, the chosen child then 'catches' the fish. After ten the child throws it back on the parachute, continuing with the waves finish the song.

To extend add more fish telling child what one to catch.

Instructions:

Place the mouse onto the parachute, bouncing it gently up and down.

Verse 1: Bounce mouse high on "up"

Verse 2: Cover mouse up and then show on "Boo"

Verse 3: On "Whee" bounce the mouse high into the air.

Verse 4: On "No more" take mouse off the parachute.

Instructions:

Begin by placing one elephant onto the parachute, sing the song whilst gently bouncing them up and down. Stop at the end of the verse and call out "Elephant" then throw another elephant on. Continue until five elephants are on.



Round and Round



No props needed



Round and round and round and round and Up, up, up.

Round and round and round and round and Down, down, down.

Round and round and round and round and In, in, in.

Round and round and round and round and out, out, out.

"STOP!"

Instructions: Stand holding

parachute saying rhyme in a steady rhythm, whilst following actions with the parachute.

Get faster and faster until you shout "STOP!"



Humpty Dumpty



Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall, Humpty Dumpty had a great fall:

All the King's horses and all the King's men,
Couldn't put Humpty together again.

Along came name with lots of glue, and put him back as good as new.

You need: Hunpty Dumpty toy

Instructions: Place Humpty on the parachute gently bounce up and down until you get to fall when you bounce Humpty off the parachute. Then bounce the parachute roughly to the rhythm. Sing "along came..." choosing a child they go and pick Humpty up and put him back on the parachute while the song continues.

Instructions: Either sing this song whilst sitting around the parachute, place scarves onto the parachute. Gently waft the parachute up and down making the scarves fly and fall. Or have all children lie/ sit under the parachute adults stand around the parachute wafting it up and down whilst sing.





Shake and STOP!



No props needed



We're gonna shake and shake and shake and STOP!

Instructions: Follow the actions

described in the song using the parachute, abruptly stop when it says "Stop" then pause expectantly before beginning again. Shake: Shake up and down quickly.

Swish: Swishing side to side.

Children can hold parachute or sit on/

Shake, shake the parachute



No props needed



Sung to: Shake, shake the apple tree.

Instructions: Sit or stand around

to rhythm of song. Shake
slightly to left/ right for ...here...there,
pause shaking briefly after each

Instructions:

Choose ten children to lie on the parachute, adults and remaining children hold edges up while gently rocking and flapping it. Sing the song on each verse choose one child to roll off the chute. On the remaining verse cover the child gently in the parachute. You could count children and children find the appropriate number.

No props needed

Instructions:



First verse: Sit ground parachute hold onto the edge rowing back and forth.

Verse two: Waft the parachute up and down.

Verse 3: Row back and forth again.



Where are you?



Sung to: fingers all

Name surname, name surname,

Where are you?

Here I am, here I am

How do you do.

You need: Voice Output



Big Mack



Choose a child to hide under the parachute. Sing the song then pull the parachute back to see the child after "Where are you?". When the children are familiar with the rhyme give them time to respond with the "Here I am..." If necessary use a voice output communication aid (VOCA)



Jack in the box



No props needed



Spoken rhyme

Jack in the box so quiet an still, Will you come out?

Of course I will!

Instructions:

Sit children into the middle of the parachute fold the parachute over the children continuing to hold onto it. Say the rhyme out loud after you have said "Will you come out?" pause for a moment and then shout of "Of course I will!" whilst quickly pulling the parachute back.



Grand Old Duke of York

When they were up they were up,


And when they were down they were down,

Sung to:

You need: Soft toy shark, fish, jelly fish







Instructions: Sit around the parachute holding the edge.

1) Waves: Make waves.

2) Shark: Put shark on and make sharp up/down moves on snap.3) Fish: Put fish on and swish parachute side to side.

4) Jelly fish: Put jelly fish on and wobble parachute quickly side to side.
